


Newsletter 1 - September 2019

Assistant Heads of School (AHOS)

Part of our school development plan (linked to Ofsted outcomes in January 19) has been to increase leadership capacity and structure within the school. This will enable us to more effectively support our key strategies in teaching and learning. As a result, we now have two Assistant Heads of School, Mrs McKerrow and Mrs Anderson. Both will continue to work in the classroom for part of the week, covering teacher PPA (planning, preparation and assessment time) but will also have time supporting and leading developments in teaching and learning as well as working very closely with myself. If, following this, you feel further support is needed, you can contact the appropriate Assistant Head: Mrs McKerrow (based across Pre-school, Reception, years 1 & 2) and Mrs Anderson (based across years 3, 4, 5 & 6) or myself.

Website

Please ensure we hold up-to-date contact details for you (phone number and where available an e-mail address) so we can include you in our electronic communications.

Sickness

Children may only return to school 48 hours following the last incident of sickness or diarrhoea.

Playground

For safety reasons...Please ensure that dogs are not brought onto the school site and that they are not left tied to the school railings.

We also state that all bikes and scooters must be dismounted before entering the school grounds. Any bikes/scooters left on the school premises are done so at the owners' own risk.

Uniform

Please ensure your child's school uniform and PE kit is labelled with their name. This will help us return any stray items. Lost property is located at the main school office.

Coloured trainers and excessive, large hairband/bows are not appropriate for school uniform.

The children go outside in all weathers, so please ensure they have suitable shoes and a coat for the autumn and winter months.

Where possible, the children will get out on the field during break and lunchtime. It would therefore be helpful if you could please provide your child with wellies. We will be looking at purchasing racks for these in the coming term.

Nuts

We are a nut-free school so please ensure you do not send anything containing nuts in your child's lunchbox or as snack as this is potentially dangerous for those with allergies.
