

Physical Development

- Encourage the children's fine motor skills by doing Dough disco/write dance.
- We will provide a variety of cutting and tracing sheets that are linked to the themed activity to improve their cutting skills by cutting round the different pictures to stick on some paper.
- Encourage the children to independently do their own zips on their coats.

Mathematical Development

- Encouraging children to use positional language through their play and through learning. We will use stick puppets and songs to explore number rhymes.
- We will encourage counting through our hall activities e.g. jumps, steps.
- We will encourage children to use subitising within their maths.
- Using construction area and outdoor area to promote counting and matching numbers.

Understanding the World

- Talk about the environments and communities we live in.
- Exploring a variety of emergency services including a visit from them.
- Explore a range of different occupations and how they help the community.

Expressive arts and design

- We will have a variety of construction resources for the children to make homes and buildings.
- We will create an emergency services room in our role play area for the children to explore and use the resources to help support and develop their imaginative play.

Literacy

- We will use stick puppets alongside our small world to encourage the children to create songs and stories.
- We will be introducing RWI to the children including initial sounds and letters.
- We will have various writing opportunities for the children including writing for different purposes.

Communication and Language

- Whilst joining the children's play, use prepositions, such as can you put the block on top of this block?
- We will listen to environmental sounds help us learn sounds around us.
- We will use different resources in our outdoor construction area to promote a love of working together as well as communicating to work as a team.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- We will use small groups to play games to encourage turn taking and sharing.
- We will use the parachute in the hall to place a soft toy such as a horse for the children to work together to make the horse jump.
- The Children will retell nursery rhymes using stick puppets and small world.
